

The NSS, YRC and PG Department of Psychology, School of Life Sciences of Marudhar Kesari Jain College for Women (Autonomous), organized an awareness programme on 'Cyber Safe Girl' on 06.09.2024 at New Seminar hall at around 02.00 p.m. for the I UG students of the college. The program began with the prayer song followed by invocation to Mother Tamil. Ms. Mehek Anjum C of II B.Sc Psychology welcomed the gathering by proposing the welcome address. The gathering was then felicitated by our most respected Principal Dr.M.Inbavalli Madam. She insisted the need for the girl students to be aware and cautious in today's social media influenced society. She also advised the girl students not to fall prey to any of the ongoing cyber crime related issues. The Chief Guest and special guests were then honored by the Principal. The session was then handed over to Mr. A.Vijaya Kumar, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Tirupattur District.

The Chief Guest addressed the student gathering by insisting the importance of education for a girl child in today's world and spoke on how girls face various threats, including violence, harassment. exploitation, and neglect. These issues manifest in different forms, from domestic abuse and child marriage to human trafficking and online harassment. The impact of these threats is profound, affecting not only their physical safety but also their mental health, educational opportunities, and overall quality of life. He also educated the students about the potential online threats like cyber bullying, phishing scams and online predators.

The special guest Mrs. A. Rani, Sub Inspector, shared her life experiences with the students and also insisted the importance of being safe and secure in today's cyber threat scenario. Special Guest Ms. M. Gnanathi, Traffic Police officer, explained the students to understand the risks associated with online activities and encouraged them to develop a strong sense of digital resilience. She also insisted the students to have confidence and to maintain self esteem, so that they can stand up to online harassment and avoid becoming the victims of exploitation.

The students found the awareness programme to be very useful and meaningful. The participants registered their valuable feedbacks about the programme by coming to the dias. Vote of thanks was proposed by Ms. Shiza Ayesha A of III B.Sc Psychology and the program came to an end by singing the National Anthem.
