CYBER CRIME AND ROLE OF GIRLS IN SOCITY - 27.09.2023 REPORT

NSS, YRC, RRC in Association with Police Department, Vaniyambadi Jointly organized "Cyber Crime and Role of Girls in Society" on starts at 2.00 pm at Marudhar Kesari Jain College for Women, Vaniyambadi. More than 700 students participated in the program. The program commenced with a melodious prayer song, followed by the Tamil Thai Vazhthu. Ms. Sofwaa Sanam, Secretary of the Innovation Cell, warmly welcomed the gathering. The event was presided over by Dr. M. Inbavalli, Principal of MKJC, along with Mr. A. Vijaya Kumar, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Mr. R. Pazhani, Inspector of Police, Vaniyambadi, Ms. K. Shanthi, Inspector of the All Women Police Station, Vaniyambadi, and Ms. C. Jayasri and Ms. S. Aruna, NSS Programme Officers. The Chief Guest, Mr. A. Vijaya Kumar, delivered an insightful address on the significant role of women in society. He emphasized the multifaceted roles women as wives, organizers, administrators, directors, and even as the central figures of their households. He also advised students to exercise caution regarding love marriages. Furthermore, he pointed out that, traditionally, women's roles have often been perceived as secondary in various societal domains, including family, religion, law, and media. Mr. R. Pazhani delivered an informative talk on Cybercrime Awareness, emphasizing the dangers of using friends' phones, public computers, cyber cafés, or free Wi-Fi for sensitive online activities, as these can result in data theft. He elaborated that cybercrime involves criminal activities aimed at targeting or exploiting computer networks and connected devices. Ms. K. Shanthi delivered a compelling address on 'Crimes Against Women,' shedding light on issues such as sexual assault, insults to modesty, kidnapping, abduction, domestic violence, human trafficking, and dowry-related persecution. She emphasized the severe physical and psychological impacts of these crimes, which hinder women from leading normal lives. Ms. Shanthi also introduced the Kavalan app, a valuable tool designed to help the people of Tamil Nadu quickly access police assistance during emergencies, such as physical threats or eve-teasing. Additionally, she highlighted the 181 helpline, an important initiative by the Delhi government aimed at enhancing women's safety, particularly in the aftermath of the Nirbhaya case. The program concluded with a vote of thanks, followed by the National Anthem.
